# Dewsbury Creative Town Arts Programme Enhancing the town through art in public spaces

**Mentee Artist Brief:** 'Changing Face of Dewsbury'- Mentee Artist Opportunity



**Budget:** £2,000 + VAT if applicable **Timeframe:** March - September 2023

#### 1. SUMMARY

Are you seeking to expand your artistic practice in public spaces and places?

Do you live, work or study in Kirklees, West Yorkshire?

Do you want to refine your engagement & consultation skills and deepen your understanding of how artists work in public spaces?

This is a unique opportunity for an early career artist to shadow an experienced artist who will be delivering a creative public engagement commission in Dewsbury, West Yorkshire. The commission is currently in development and will be a participatory photography/ portraiture-based commission that connects local people in Dewsbury with the regeneration and changes happening in their town, how the town feels and how they hope it will feel in the future.

## 2. WHAT IS THE DEWSBURY CREATIVE TOWN ARTS PROGRAMME?

Arts organisation Beam has been appointed by Kirklees Council to produce the Dewsbury Creative Town Arts Programme between 2020 - 2023 which is part of the Dewsbury Blueprint 10-year plan to revitalise the town.

The overarching vision for the programme is: "The Creative Town Arts Programme will enhance Dewsbury's ambitious future plans through art in public spaces engaging with its diverse communities, celebrating its unique heritage, and inspiring creativity.







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The programme will bring all communities together and have a positive impact on everyone's experience of the town centre."

The cross-cutting theme across the programme is to explore local people's connections to key places in Dewsbury as the town undergoes major transformation through the Blueprint regeneration plans. # 3. CONTEXT

The <u>Dewsbury Blueprint 10-year plan</u> seeks to honour the heritage of this beautiful town and build on recent investments. It aims to bring more activity into the town centre, make it more attractive and improve accessibility.

The Blueprint includes plans to make Dewsbury a destination town by introducing more green space, making the most of the town's heritage assets, by improving and extending the public realm, making it a more attractive and pleasant place to spend time.

The appointed lead artists for this commission are <u>Lenny & Whale</u>, a partnership between Artist Fabric Lenny and Creative Producer Katrina Whale. They deliver exciting projects that culminate in playful artwork and interventions. They love working with people, in the outdoors and in non-traditional art spaces, bringing the magic of creativity into the lives of people in a way that is ambitious and accessible. They often use workshops as a starting point for gathering and developing visual ideas and themes which then evolve into distinctive pieces of artwork, shared and celebrated within the public domain.

## 4. MENTORING OPPORTUNITY

#### 4.1 Overview

With support from Arts Council England, we are pleased to be able to offer an early career artist with connections to Kirklees, the opportunity to shadow an experienced artist and receive mentoring. This opportunity has been developed to help break down some of the barriers early career artists may face in developing an artistic practice in the public realm.







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#### 4.2 About you

- You will have a keen interest in engaging with people as part of your artistic practice
- You will be highly motivated to use this mentoring opportunity to take your development as an Artist to the next level
- An interest in photography as a medium is desirable, but formal skills in this area are not a requirement
- You will have a strong interest in exploring the potential for presenting your work in public places and spaces which you will explore through this opportunity

#### 4.3 What are the benefits?

You will gain:

- Understanding about what is involved in designing artworks for public places and spaces
- Understanding of the costs involved
- Knowledge of the practical considerations when designing artworks for public spaces
- Hands on experience around public consultation and engagement and how this can feed into design development
- Increased connections
- Signposting to further opportunities
- Space to consider how you might develop your artistic practice in the public realm

#### 4.4 What will it involve?

Following an initial meeting with Beam and the Artist mentor you will be invited to attend project meetings and site visits, spend time with the mentor during the artistic development process, support community engagement activity and join 1-2-1 meetings. You will be asked to keep a menteeship / learning journal to review at an evaluation meeting. The bursary estimates a minimum participation of 10 days including travel.







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#### 4.5 What support will you get?

Beam will provide ongoing support via email and phone as required as well as holding a 1-2-1 meeting. Upon completion an evaluation meeting will be held.

## 6. BUDGET

Artists will be eligible to receive a bursary of  $\pm 2000 + VAT$  if applicable to support the artists time and travel costs. Approx. 10 days work is expected to be delivered within this fee.
